We adapted some of the language used in the curriculum to incorporate terms that were commonly used by FHS youth. We have gained this knowledge from sexual behavior and risk/protective factor survey conducted during Step 1.

We will be using factually up-to-date materials. As suggested, we will play the song, "Let's Talk About Sex," only instead of the rap video, to avoid having youth react to the outdated fashions in the video. Furthermore, we will substitute new videos for "The Subject is HIV" and "Truth About Sex" in order to give the most factually up-to-date material. We are still looking for appropriate substitute videos here, but we know that we must make sure the new videos still address the same content.

Modules 2 and 6	We are making sure to incorporate common, local HIV and pregnancy myths into these modules. We have gained this knowledge from sexual behavior and risk/protective factor survey conducted during Step 1.
Module 2, 5, and 6	We are making sure that facilitators have become knowledgeable about the types of sexual behaviors and attitudes in which FHS youth are engaging, as well as the language they use to talk about these behaviors, to make these activities as relevant as possible to participating youth. We have gained this knowledge from sexual behavior and

Module 6	In order to build upon our relationship with the local Planned Parenthood, and in recognition of the resources they provide, as identified in Step 1's GTO Resource Assessment Tool, we plan to invite a guest speaker from the local Planned Parenthood clinic to cover the factual information in this activity.
Module 7	In the "How to Make Condoms Fun and Pleasurable" activity found in Module #7, we have decided to change the name of the activity to avoid controversy in the community. However, it is critical that youth have the opportunity to talk about strategies that increase the likelihood that they will use condoms with their partner, and so the content of this activity will remain.
